1st Sunday of Holy Cross

In the last reflection for the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, it discussed the power of the cross as the sign of salvation. The cross for Syriacs does not only represent the death of our Lord Jesus Christ, but His entire plan of salvation in His mercy. For this reason, we celebrate an entire Season of the Holy Cross, to focus on the mighty tool Christ has armed us with: His cross, our source of strength and deliverance. We have been blessed to see what has been awaited throughout all of time since Adam. In this season, we reflect upon the tool that Christ used to undo the illness of sin, which Adam brought upon mankind in the Garden. Because Christ is the Eternal Hope, He revealed to His prophets from the beginning glimpses of the hope of His cross by which He destroyed death and armed us against Satan.

From the beginning of Scripture, God foreshadowed

to those who believe in Him that He would save them from all their distresses by His sacrificial love. St. Ephrem points out a vast number of these prefigurements. The one he uses mostly commonly is the story of Abraham being told to take his only son, Isaac, to be sacrificed atop a mountain (Gen. 22:1-18). But God reveals to Abraham on the mountain that He actually does not want the sacrifice of his son, but a lamb hanging in a tree. So too was Christ the Lamb hanged in the Tree of Life, the cross, atop the mountain of Golgotha that replaced the sacrifice of man by Himself. Just as Isaac was saved by the lamb, so mankind was saved by the sacrifice of Jesus. Isaac was untied from the altar, and mankind was untied from the altar of sin and death.

There are a great many other parts of the Old Testament that reveal various aspects of the cross. Just as the sacrifice of Isaac being replaced shows us Christ replacing the sentence against mankind, other stories show different aspects. Jacob's Dream (Gen. 28:10-15) is another great example. Jacob has a dream of a ladder leading to heaven from Earth. This ladder, then, is the cross, which has reconciled heaven and Earth. Not only that, but the cross is the way that brings us to heaven. To whatever degree sin has separated us from God and one another, the cross has reunited us.

The last example that will be noted here is a battle from the Exodus of the Hebrews from Egypt (Ex. 18:8-13). As they traveled to the Promise Land, led by Moses, an enemy king, Amalek, attacked them to kill them. But God told Moses to spread his arms and lift them up – so long as he held them up, the army of Amalek was losing and was eventually defeated, saving Israel. It is a confusing story in itself because it seems odd that God should give Moses the power to defeat the enemy army by spreading his arms – indeed, to the Hebrews it was never fully understood. But we understand the analogy – God told Moses to spread his arms to save Israel to reveal that He would spread His arms upon the cross and save His people. Christ has defeated the armies of evil by His arms spread wide upon the cross. No army can stand against those who stand beneath the arms of the cross.

What thousands of generations of prophets and faithful awaited without knowledge, we know and do daily when we make the sign of the cross. The cross that delivered mankind from sin and death, the cross that links heaven and Earth, and the cross upon which the Creator stretched out His arms to empower us is ours in every sign of the cross. Let us call this to mind as we pray:

Lord, may Your precious and life-giving cross be for us an armor of righteousness, a companion of assistances, and a fount of immortality, O Messiah our God. By it, may we fight against all the immaterial robbers of sin in the valley of Jericho, the land of curses. From there, may it be our guide to the gate of paradise and the heavenly Jerusalem. By it, may we enter the place of life and dwell in the abodes of rest. There, we shall ceaselessly offer glory and thanks to You, and to Your Father, and to Your living and Holy Spirit. 



The Saint Rafka Prayers and Squares Quilt will meet on Monday evenings from 6-9pm in Wickett Hall. There are a couple of extra sewing machines for use in the hall, but if you have a portable machine please bring it with you, as well as an extra pair of small scissors if you have them. Even if you have never sewn before, it is very easy to learn, so don't be afraid to try. There are kits already made up for

prayer squares. If you are not interested in quilting but would like to support us in our efforts, there are a few things that we need. Steam Irons, 1-2 Ironing boards, sewing thread in shades of gray, white, cream and blue. But neutral shades of gray and white are the most used. Pins, needles, scissors, extra working sewing machines, card stock for making tags for the quilts would also be helpful. We have a lot of prayers, work, and friendship to offer. See you this week!

Prayers and Squares is a prayer ministry that involves making prayer quilts and prayer squares for those facing medical, spiritual, emotional difficulties, or anyone in the Parish that is active duty military. Don't know how to quilt? That's ok, we can teach you. Not interested in sewing? That's ok, we will need help with staying organized, record keeping and correspondence. What is needed are willing hearts and hands to do God's work and pray together for those in need, and each other too.

A prayer quilt or square, once requested, is made and tied with each knot representing a

prayer for that individual and their specific needs. The recipient must be willing to receive the quilt and the prayers. The purpose of the group is not to give away quilts, but to offer a physical representation of God's love and the prayers of the community. A recipient is able to wrap themselves in prayer during a difficult time. The quilt itself has no power, but the prayers offered do.

A Unique Parishioner Call for Help

Dear Friends, Re: End-Stage Kidney Disease

Some of you may already know: I have end-stage kidney disease. My kidneys do not work well enough to keep me alive, and my treatment options are limited to dialysis or kidney transplant.

Regular hemodialysis treatments, three times per week for four hours at a time, help my kidneys do their job and keep me alive. But a transplant would offer me the ability to live a longer, healthier, more normal life and with more freedom.

Finding a kidney for a transplant is not easy. There are 100,000+ people, just like me, on the waiting list for a deceased donor kidney. Time is not on our side. Some die while waiting. I've been waiting nearly six years, about a year longer than the average wait time of five years.

There is another option: receiving a kidney from a living donor. Asking a family member or a friend to donate a kidney is very difficult for me, extremely personal, takes much thought and involves your family's consideration. Your decision will not affect our relationship, and I absolutely do not want a donor feeling pressured in any way.

You may not know a lot about living donation, which I did not until recently. Understandably, many people are fearful of surgery and what living with one kidney will mean for them. Here's some basic information about kidney donation:

- Most people are born with an extra kidney only one is needed to live a long, healthy life.
- As a living donor, you will have a separate team of Healthcare professionals to evaluate you. Their job is to help YOU understand the risks and benefits, looking out for YOUR best interests.
- Cost of your evaluation and surgery will be covered by my insurance; the hospital can provide to you more information.
- Most donor surgery is done laparoscopically, meaning through tiny incisions.
- Recuperation is usually fairly quick, generally two weeks, for people with desk jobs, to six weeks, for jobs involving heavy lifting.

What is a paired kidney exchange? Roughly one-third of kidney failure patients with a willing living donor will be unable to receive the kidney because of incompatibility. In a paired kidney exchange, a donor may donate their kidney to another recipient in exchange for a compatible kidney for their loved one.

Before deciding, you can explore the living donation program by calling MUSC's Kelly Canavan, my Living Donor Coordinator, at 843-792-1594.

A living donation may not be right for you, but you can still help. Please help by sharing my story, spreading the word about kidney disease, raising awareness of living donation and helping me and the many others on the waiting list.



The totals to the **to the right** are counted by the ushers during the Divine Liturgy and tabulated.



So you, my child, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. And what you heard from me through many witnesses entrust to faithful people who will have the ability to teach others as well. Bear your share of hardship along with me like a good soldier of Christ Jesus. To satisfy the one who recruited him, a soldier does not become entangled in the business affairs of life. Similarly, an athlete cannot receive the winner's crown except by competing according to the rules. The hardworking farmer ought to have the first share of the crop. Reflect on what I am saying, for the Lord will give you understanding in everything.

Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David: such is my gospel, for which I am suffering, even to the point of chains, like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. Therefore, I bear with everything for the sake of those who are chosen, so that they too may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, together with eternal glory.

Mark 10:35-45

Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to him and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." He replied, "What do you wish [me] to do for you?" They answered him,



"Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left." Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" They said to him, "We can." Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink, you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right or at my left is not mine to give but is for those for whom it has been prepared. When the ten heard this, they became indignant at James and John. Jesus summoned them and said to them, "You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones make their authority over them felt. But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

"But how shall I teach them who knows so little myself?" Adele asked. The Lady replied, "Teach them their catechism, how to sign themselves with the sign of the Cross, and how to approach the sacraments; that is what I wish you to do. Go and fear nothing. I will help you." Adele devoted the rest of her life to the task. Such a fervent yet humble person is an inspiration for all of us. That's why the theme for the 2018 Radiothon will be "Our Lady of Good Help." We hope to bring attention to the Shrine in Champion, Wisconsin dedicated to these apparitions, the only apparitions in the United States which are approved by the Catholic Church.
