To the Good One is due glory and honor this evening, and all the day of our lives, now and forever. **Amen**.

SEDRO

Cel: O God, full of tenderness, you have given your Church this season of Lent, this time of blessing, healing and reconciliation. O Christ, our friend, by your own fasting and self-denial you taught us to fast; you wished us to understand the essential purpose of life, the meaning of the world and its existence, and the greatness of your love and goodness. Pour forth your mighty power upon those who repent; soften the hearts of sinners, your children, and they will return to you, weeping with sorrow and broken in heart; then they will know and love you. Let us meditate on this Lent and its fruits: fasting and prayer purify the soul and make the body chaste; fasting and prayer spread a marvelous light, the light of Christ, on those who fast and pray; fasting and prayer raise the spirit, restrain the passions and the mercy from on high pours forth; fasting and prayer dispel evil spirits and the Holy Spirit dwells in the soul created to be the temple of God.

O God, may we praise you with pure lips and with angelic hymns that come from chaste hearts. May we meditate upon your fasting, and follow your path that we may attain you and praise you, forever. **Amen.**

QOLO

Cantors: In your fast, O Lord, you gather your entire flock
that we may adore you and receive your forgiveness.

TRISAGION

The congregation stands and the Trisagion is then sung three times. May be sung in Syriac.



SCRIPTURE READING

A reading from Holy Scripture is now proclaimed.

FETGOMO (Gospel Acclamation)

GOSPEL

Deacon/Cantor: *Before the proclamation of the Gospel of our Savior, announcing life for our souls, we offer this incense, and ask for your mercy, O Lord.*

The celebrant burns incense.

Cel: Peace ☩ be with you. **And with your Spirit.**

From the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Saint **N.**, who proclaimed life to the world. Let us listen to the proclamation of life and salvation for our souls.

The celebrant incenses the Book of Gospels three times. Meanwhile, the deacon proclaims:

Deacon/Cantor: *Remain silent, O listeners, for the Holy Gospel is about to be proclaimed to you. Listen, and give glory and thanks to the Word of the living God.*

The celebrant begins the gospel using the appropriate words. At the conclusion of the gospel, he sings or says:

Cel: This is the Truth! ☩ Peace be with you!

KOROZOUTO

People of faith, praise the Lord; for He has rescued the afflicted and has redeemed the sorrowing. To Him be glory forever. Amen.

(HOMILY)

PROFESSION OF FAITH

We believe ☩ in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

We believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. We confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and we look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the ☩ life of the world to come. Amen.

ACCESS TO THE ALTAR

Cel: I will go to the altar of God, to God who gives joy to my youth. Through the abundance of your goodness I will enter your house and worship in your holy temple. **Guide me, O Lord, in your fear, and instruct me in your justice.**

Cel: Pray to the Lord for me. **May the Lord accept your offering and have mercy on us through your prayer.**

TRANSFER OF THE OFFERINGS

The Lord reigns clothed in majesty. Alleluia!

Look upon us as we fast and pray, O Lord! As we turn our hearts to Him Whose love is poured out on those who call to Him in faith and humble hope. Who does not withhold His compassion to those who seek refuge in Him. Open to us poor sinners the treasury of Your compassion. Our gifts, Lord, receive.

ACCEPTANCE OF THE OFFERINGS

Cel: Almighty and wondrous God, Who accepted the offerings of the just, accept these gifts from Your faithful who have chosen them from among their possessions and presented them to You and to Your holy name as a pledge of their sincere love. Give them in exchange of their perishable gifts an imperishable kingdom. **Amen.**

COMMEMORATIONS

Cel: O God, you accepted the sacrifice of Abel in the wilderness, that of faithful Abraham on the mountain and the widow's mite in the temple. Accept our offering, and in your mercy, remember the living and the dead for whom we pray. **Amen.**

INCENSATION OF THE OFFERINGS

Meanwhile, the congregation recites or chants:

Blessed is God in our trials. Praised is God in our afflictions. Exalted is God in our victory. Have mercy upon us sinners who make our offerings to you. Hear our prayers and have mercy on us as we offer You our incense. At all times let us give thanks to God.

RITE OF PEACE

DOXOLOGY

Cel: Glory ✠ be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

PRAYER FOR PEACE

Cel: O Father, God of peace and Lord of security, make us worthy to embrace one another with a sincere kiss in the spirit of your unending love, that we may raise glory and thanks to you, and to your only Son, and to your Holy Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

EXCHANGE OF PEACE

Cel: Peace to you, O Altar of God. Peace to the holy mysteries placed upon you. Peace to you, server of the Holy Spirit.

DIACONAL PROCLAMATION

Deacon: Let us give the greeting of peace to our neighbor with love and faith that are pleasing to God.

The greeting of peace is exchanged.

PRAYER FOR THE IMPOSITION OF THE HAND

Cel: O Lord, we bow before you to receive your blessings and assistance because we are weak and you are the support and refuge of all. We raise glory to you, and to your only Son, and to your Holy Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

PRAYER OF THE VEIL

Cel: O Lord, may the light of your face shine upon us. Deliver us from every evil and blot out all our transgressions, that we may raise glory and thanks to you, and to your only Son, and to your Holy Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER

DIALOGUE

Cel: The love of God the Father ✠, and the grace of the only-begotten Son ✠, and the communion and indwelling of the Holy Spirit ✠ be with you, my brothers and sisters, forever. **And with your Spirit.**

Cel: Let us lift up our thoughts, our minds, and our hearts. **We lift them up to the Lord.**

Cel: Let us give thanks to the Lord with reverence and worship him with humility. **It is right and just.**

PRAISE AND THANKSGIVING

Cel: Truly it is right and just to glorify and exalt you, O Maker of all creation. With the angels we glorify you, and with voices of praise we cry out and proclaim:

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

Holy, holy, holy, mighty Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your great glory. Hosanna in the highest. ✠ Blessed is he who has come and will come in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Cel: You are holy, O God the Father, and abundant in mercy. Because of your love for us, you sent your Son into the world and became flesh of the Virgin Mary for our salvation.

INSTITUTION NARRATIVE

Cel: And on the day before his life-giving passion, He took bread in his holy hands. He blessed, ✠ sanctified ✠, and broke it ✠, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my body which is broken and given for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins and for eternal life. **Amen.**

Cel: In a similar way, over the chalice of wine mixed with water, ✠ he blessed ✠ and sanctified it ✠, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is my blood of the new covenant, which will be poured out and given for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins and for eternal life. **Amen.**

ANAMNESIS

Cel: He then commanded and instructed them, saying: Each time you celebrate these Mysteries, you remember my death and resurrection until I come again. **We remember your death, O Lord. We profess your resurrection. We await your second coming. We implore your mercy and compassion. We ask for the forgiveness of sins, and may your mercy rest upon us.**

Cel: O Lord, we remember your coming that saved us and, as we await your second coming, we offer praise and ask you: On the day when you will judge the righteous and sinners, do not condemn us because of our sins, but have compassion and mercy on us. Turn your face away from our sins and assist us. For this your Church implores you and, through you and with you, implores your Father, saying: **Have mercy on us, Almighty Father. Have mercy on us.**

The Celebrant crosses his hands over his chest and prays:

Cel: O Lord, as we, your sinful children, receive your graces, we thank you for them and because of them. **We praise you. We bless you. We adore you. We glorify you. We profess our faith in you, and we ask you: Have compassion on us, O God, have mercy on us, and hear us.**

EPICLESIS

Deacon: How awesome is this moment, my beloved, for the living Holy Spirit descends and rests upon this offering for our sanctification. Let us stand with reverence as we pray.

Cel: Have mercy on us, O Lord, have mercy on us. Send us your life-giving Spirit from heaven to hover over this offering, to make it the life-giving body and blood, and also to pardon and sanctify us.

The celebrant, kneeling on both knees, extends his hands and sings in Syriac or in English:

Cel: Hear us, O Lord. Hear us, O Lord. Hear us, O Lord. And may your living Holy Spirit come and rest upon us and upon this offering. **Kyrie eleison! Kyrie eleison! Kyrie eleison!**

Cel: That by his descent he make this bread ☩ the Body of Christ our God. **Amen.**

Cel: And make the mixture in this chalice ☩ the Blood of Christ our God. **Amen.**

Cel: May those who share in these Mysteries be cleansed, ☩ body and soul, from every sin and receive eternal life.

INTERCESSIONS

Cel: O Lord, accept our intercessions and prayers, and grant security to your people and peace to your flock. Protect our shepherds: **N.**, the Pope of Rome, **N.** Peter, our Patriarch of Antioch, **N.**, our Bishop, and all the bishops of the true faith. Assist the priests, the deacons, and all those who serve your holy Church, so that they may intercede and pray to you on our behalf. We pray to you, O Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**

1. Remember, O Lord, all those who have asked us to pray for them, those who desired but were unable to make an offering, and those who assist your Holy Church. Be a shelter and refuge for them, for you are the Savior of all. We pray to you, O Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**
2. Remember, O Lord, the civil leaders in our country and throughout the world. Bless and protect our President, our Governor, and all who serve in elected and appointed office. Enlighten their consciences to bring security and peace to your people. We pray to you, O Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**
3. Heal the sick and distressed in our community. End the Corona Virus from the world. Send your angles of peace to comfort them and bring the sick to recovery. Grant special graces to those who are caregivers so that they will be able to rest and have strength. We pray to you, O Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**
4. Hear and answer the prayers that we each lift up in the silence of our hearts to you. *(People may now voice their intentions. When all are finished, continue on...)* Hear the petitions and pleas of your people, we pray to you, O Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**
5. Remember, O Lord, the holy Virgin Mary, Mother of God, and the prophets, apostles,

martyrs, and confessors, Saint Rafka, the patroness of this parish, (*Saint N. whose feast we celebrate today*) and all the saints. Assist us through their prayers and make us worthy of their reward. We pray to you, O Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**

6. Remember, O Lord, the Fathers and teachers of the truth faith who have endured sufferings for the sake of your Church and your people. May we truly and faithfully follow in their footsteps. We pray to you, O Lord.

The Deacon concludes the intercessions, saying:

Deacon: Favorably remember, O Lord, our parents, brothers and sisters, teachers, and all the faithful departed here and everywhere who have gone to their rest, (*especially N.*) and all inscribed in our Book of Life. Forgive us and them of all sins and offences. Through our Lord God and Savior Jesus Christ, who is without sin, we hope to find mercy and forgiveness for our sins and for theirs. **Grant rest, O God, to the departed, and forgive the sins we have committed, with or without full knowledge.**

Cel: O God, pardon and forgive us and the departed ✠ so that your blessed name may be glorified in us and in all things, with the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, and that of your living Holy Spirit, now and forever. **As it was, is now, and shall be forever. Amen.**

ELEVATION AND BLESSING

Then all recite together:

Glory be to the Father Who sent His Son for our sake; adoration to the Son Who, by His crucifixion, redeemed us; thanksgiving to the Holy Spirit through Whom the Mystery of our salvation was brought to fullness. Blessed is God Who, in His love, gave us life. To Him be glory. Amen.

COMMUNION RITE

LORD'S PRAYER

Cel: O God the Father, you strengthen and encourage us because we are weak. We implore you to purify us from every sin and to accept our offering, so that in one spirit we may call upon you, praying:

With extended hands:

Our Father...but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

Cel: O Lord, lead us not into the trials and temptation that we do not have the strength to overcome, but deliver us from every evil. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, with your only Son, and your Holy Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

PENITENTIAL RITE

Cel: Peace ☩ be with you. **And with your Spirit.**

Deacon: Bow your heads before the God of mercy, before his forgiving altar, and before the Body and Blood of our Savior, who gives life to those who partake of him, and receive the blessing from the Lord.

Cel: O Lord, bless your worshipers who bow before you and implore you. Make them worthy of your mercy and forgive their sins, for you are almighty and rich in compassion. We raise glory and thanks to you, to your only Son, and to your Holy Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

Cel: The grace of the most Holy Trinity, ☩ eternal and consubstantial, be with you, my brothers and sisters, forever. **And with your Spirit.**

Deacon: Let us look to God with reverence and humility, and ask him for mercy and compassion.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Cel: Holy Gifts for the holy, ☩ with perfection, purity, and sanctity. **One holy Father, One holy Son, One Holy Spirit, blessed be the name of the Lord. For He is One in heaven and on earth, to Him be glory forever.**

All extend their hands in prayer and say:
