MASS INTENTIONS

Mass intentions are a good way to remember and pray for your loved ones, alive or deceased. If you would like to request an intention please remember to submit your intentions for Liturgy ASAP by calling the parish office at 864.469.9119 or by email at <u>bill@saintrafka.org</u>. Please remember that it is rare to be able to have your intention the following Sunday! Masses are now generally booked up about three months in advance.

BAPTISM & CHRISMATION

Baptism in the Maronite Rite is always accompanied by *Chrismation* (Confirmation). Both Sacraments are given by a priest, and always in the same ceremony. Preparation to receive the Sacraments of Baptism and Chrismation is required. We encourage this to happen before the birth of your child. Please contact the <u>Church Office</u> for more details.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Anointing of the Sick is routinely offered during the Divine Liturgy on Wednesday evening and during pastoral visits by the priest to homebound and ill parishioners. Let me know if you will be in the hospital or have other special needs. Contact the <u>Church Office</u>.

THE MYSTERY OF CROWNING (MARRIAGE)

Couples must contact the pastor **at least** six months prior to the desired date of the wedding. To initiate the marriage preparation process or if you have questions for weddings taking place at Saint Rafka. Contact the <u>Church Office</u>.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Registration forms and welcome packets are available in the church office and the vestibule. Membership is a condition for the reception of the sacraments of baptism/confirmation, first reconciliation, first Eucharist, and Crowning (marriage). Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be sacramental sponsors. You must be a registered, contributing member for at least three months before a certificate is provided.

Jonah 2:1-11

But the LORD sent a great fish to swallow Jonah, and he remained in the belly of the fish three days and three nights. Jonah prayed to the LORD, his God, from the belly of the fish: Out of my distress I called to the LORD, and he answered me; From the womb of Sheol I cried for help, and you heard my voice. You cast me into the deep, into the heart of the sea, and the flood enveloped me; All your breakers and your billows passed over me. Then I said, "I am banished from your sight! How will I again look upon your holy temple?" The water surged around me up to my neck; the deep enveloped me; seaweed wrapped around my head. I went down to the roots of the mountains; to the land whose bars closed behind me forever, But you brought my life up from the pit, O LORD, my God. When I became faint, I remembered the LORD; My prayer come to you in your holy temple. Those who worship worthless idols abandon their hope for mercy. But I, with thankful voice, will sacrifice to you; What I have vowed I will pay: deliverance is from the LORD. Then the LORD commanded the fish to vomit Jonah upon dry land.

I Corinthians 15:12-26

For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death.



has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised.

Reflection

We the Church and her children, celebrate today, Jesus' glorious resurrection. In the *Mazmooro* we proclaim:

The Church and her children rejoice, for the Good Shepherd has risen. He laid down his life for his sheep and saved them by his resurrection.

Not only the Church but all of creation is rejuvenated and refreshed by the resurrection of Christ, as we hear in the *Qolo*:

Today all creation rejoices and exults in praise, for the son of God has been raised from the tomb in glory.

And the Risen Lord is now our food from today-on and for life eternal:

The holy and faithful Church looks at Christ on her altars, where his body is made food and his blood a spiritual drink.

> Every day the Church takes delight in Christ and will find joy with him in the heavenly kingdom.

Reflecting on the Gospel of the Resurrection, the women at the tomb, as well as on the Parable of the Virgins' awaiting their Lord's coming, the Church prays at the <u>*Etro*</u>:

O Lord, the fragrant Sea, the women carried perfume to the tomb in order to embalm your holy body. Yet, you are the sweet aroma for the life of every soul. Accept our incense and grant that, like the blessed women, we may hasten to you, and be refreshed by your lifegiving fragrance.

Likewise the letter of Saint Paul today enlightens our minds with how Christ Jesus bears the "first-fruits" of this new creation that has sprouted through his resurrection, and which will come to completion in his return, as death is swept away.

In the *Hoossoyo*, the Church calls Christ the *Never Ceasing Light* and the *Maker of life* who by his incarnation entered into our world of sleep and awakened us with his *living voice*, bringing about our redemption and new life:

> Yesterday his side was pierced by a lance, and today, in his compassion, he opened up for us the waters of baptism.

And now, the Bride, asks for herself and her Children:

as you saved us by your passion and granted us life by your resurrection, so now clothe our bodies with the power of your Spirit, that we may all shine in the robe of glory and be able to meet you, O Christ, the true Bridegroom.

Therefore let us *say: Hosanna:* He is risen! Let us rejoice and celebrate in the Trinity, with the heavenly Father – the Father of Mercies – whose Son was dead – and now has come back to life! (Lk: 15-24), and (Ps. 118: 22-24).

Truly He Is Risen!


The Servants of Mary and Joseph Lay Carmelite Community



This "St. Michael" icon will come alive before you as the visiting master iconographer and expert instructor, Theodoros Papadopoulos from Greece, guides you, step by step, through the ancient techniques of Byzantine Iconography.

Let us journey together, discovering anew, this traditional artistic expression of theology and spirituality, often called the "meeting place of the Divine". Whether you are absolute beginner or an advanced artist, this workshop offers an opportunity to learn or refine your techniques in this sacred art.

The techniques of painting will be taught in a clear and concrete way enabling the students to follow the instructor for an outcome of a beautiful icon.

The course focuses on the art of egg tempera painting. Our goal is for students to

understand and learn the artistic practices as well as the philosophy of Orthodox lconography. The coursework is divided into individual steps; the instructor explains the principles and then demonstrates each phase in detail, answering all questions. Through the process of demonstrations the stages as well the whole method of painting an icon will be presented. From the very beginning to the completion of the course, every student will work on his or her painting with assistance by the instructor.

The size of the icon is 13.50X10 inches.
