MASS INTENTIONS

Mass intentions are a good way to remember and pray for your loved ones, alive or deceased. If you would like to request an intention please remember to submit your intentions for Liturgy ASAP by calling the parish office at 864.469.9119 or by email at <u>bill@saintrafka.org</u>. Please remember that it is rare to be able to have your intention the following Sunday! Masses are now generally booked up about three months in advance.

BAPTISM & CHRISMATION

Baptism in the Maronite Rite is always accompanied by *Chrismation* (Confirmation). Both Sacraments are given by a priest, and always in the same ceremony. Preparation to receive the Sacraments of Baptism and Chrismation is required. We encourage this to happen before the birth of your child. Please contact the <u>Church Office</u> for more details.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Anointing of the Sick is routinely offered during the Divine Liturgy on Wednesday evening and during pastoral visits by the priest to homebound and ill parishioners. Let me know if you will be in the hospital or have other special needs. Contact the <u>Church Office</u>.

THE MYSTERY OF CROWNING (MARRIAGE)

Couples must contact the pastor **at least** six months prior to the desired date of the wedding. To initiate the marriage preparation process or if you have questions for weddings taking place at Saint Rafka. Contact the <u>Church Office</u>.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Registration forms and welcome packets are available in the church office and the vestibule. Membership is a condition for the reception of the sacraments of baptism/confirmation, first reconciliation, first Eucharist, and Crowning (marriage). Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be sacramental sponsors. You must be a registered, contributing member for at least three months before a certificate is provided.

Scripture Readings

Isaiah 7:10-16

Again the LORD spoke to Ahaz: Ask for a sign from the LORD, your God; let it be deep as Sheol, or high as the sky! But Ahaz answered, "I will not ask! I will not tempt the LORD!" Then he said: Listen, house of David! Is it not enough that you weary human beings? Must you also weary my God? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign; the young woman, pregnant and about to bear a son, shall name him Emmanuel. Curds and honey he will eat so that he may learn to reject evil and choose good; for before the child learns to reject evil and choose good, the land of those two kings whom you dread shall be deserted.

Eph. 3:1-13

Because of this, I, Paul, a prisoner of Christ [Jesus] for you Gentiles—if, as I suppose, you have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for your benefit, [namely, that] the mystery-was made known to me by revelation, as I have written briefly earlier. When you read this you can understand my insight into the mystery of Christ, which was not made known to human beings in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit, that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel. Of this I became a minister by the gift of God's grace that was granted me in accord with the exercise of his power. To me, the very least of all the holy ones, this grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the inscrutable riches of Christ, and to bring to light [for all] what is the plan of the mystery hidden from ages past in God who created all things, so that the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known through the church to the principalities and authorities in the heavens. This was according to the eternal purpose that he accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord, in whom we have boldness of speech and confidence of access through faith in him.-So I ask you not to lose heart over my afflictions for you; this is your glory.

ow this is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the holy Spirit. Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly. Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "Behold, the virgin shall be with child and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means "God is with us." When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home. He had no relations with her until she bore a son. and he named him lesus.



Reflection

The Letter of Saint Paul to the Ephesians today speaks of "the mysteries hidden in the wisdom of God". In the Gospel these mysteries are being revealed to Blessed Joseph in his dream: He is clearly worried about Mary being pregnant prematurely with a child. This is a difficult challenge for Joseph. He is being tested. He needs divine help and direction which he graciously receives.

Like the Patriarchs, Jacob and Joseph of the Old Testament, the Joseph in the Gospel of Christ is now is being guided by an angel in his dream. The

contents of Joseph's two dreams are amazing. His wife will have a child, but by the Holy Spirit; and there is trouble on the horizon. He needs to trust in God's promise and his plan of salvation, in spite of the difficulties. Joseph's trust and faithfulness will be manifested by his actions.

Likewise, in our Maronite prayers this Sunday, our mediation is focused on Saint Joseph's incomprehension and doubts - before this great mystery before him – and then the reassurances that he receives from above that this is all God's will. The Qolo (centered before the Qadishat and the Mazmooro after it), in the style of the Syriac dialogue hymns, address this issue

directly. We the church and her children, in hindsight, find ourselves in a position of sympathy with the divine ordinance. We encourage *the Joseph in us* to believe; to let his righteousness and fidelity come through so that he (and us too) may pass the test of faith!

The underlying lesson in this announcement to Joseph – as well as the other previous announcements to Zechariah, Mary, and Elizabeth – is that *God's ways* are amazing and perplexing. They challenge the limits of our faith and vision – just as they did with Abraham and the patriarchs of the past in the first covenant. Like Joseph, with the help of divine grace, they open our hearts to the

> eternal salvation, and the promise of life in the Kingdom. Clearly God wants to give us more than that little happiness – that we are normally willing to settle for! The Father wants to give us Christ Jesus, to be with us always, Emanuel – (Hebrew: God is with us) – that through him we may have life in its fullness; to let his Holy Family be ours; that we may dwell in the divine

greater expectations of

From generation to generation this *heavenly family* has been calling us to our home in the Kingdom. Now, as members of this *Holy Family* of Christ, let us welcome our King with all our hearts – with words of praise and actions of charity and hospitality towards others – that he may graciously grant us eternal citizenship in his Kingdom.

Saturday Vigil Mass, 4:00 PM Sunday Mass, 8:30 AM Sunday Solemn Mass, 11:00 AM Other Ritual Mass, 5:00 PM (Latin, Syro-Malabar, Ukrainian(?)



We make quilts! But we do other things also. We make prayer squares(small quilts) for the Neonatal Intensive care unit, as well as angel gowns and pouches for micro preemies through full term babies. At a time of such intense grief a parent needs to be able to say goodbye with some dignity. We have been sharing fabric with other catholic groups who are sewing for charity. We had an abundance of military fabrics, so we shared with a group that makes pillow cases for the veterans home. We donated enough fabric to get another church started with making quilts for the children's hospital. We have shared children's fabric with a group that makes quilts for the Ronald McDonald House. We also share fabric that goes to quilts made for Steps to Hope(a battered women and children's shelter). We use our long arm machine to quilt tops that have been made for Steps to Hope, and the Ronald McDonald house. We are Busy!!!

If you are facing physical, spiritual, or other life challenges, please request a prayer quilt. We want to wrap you in the comfort of God and the prayers of the church. Your name can remain private if you wish.We would love to give a quilt for every new baby born into the Saint Rafka church Family. Please let us know if you are expecting. Any church member who joins the military is also eligible for a quilt and a prayer square for the inside of their helmet. All you need to do is call the office with the name, and the prayers requested.

We need help. Come and sew with us on Tuesdays from 10 am to 2 pm. If you don't know how to sew, we are happy to teach you, we also have extra machines we can loan. Are you busy and can't come on Tuesdays? No worries, we have quilt kits that are ready to sew, and you can sew at home. We can make it work. If you prefer hand work, we need ties placed in quilts and labels sewn on.

We were blessed by a HUGE donation from Walmart this year. We got 600 bolts(2 pallets) of fabric from them. They are no longer selling fabric from bolts, and donated all the stock to us. What an amazing blessing! We also keep our eye out for estate sales. That is where all the military fabric came from. We got a lot of children's fabric from a friend who was downsizing. We are always happy to accept donations of cotton fabric suitable for making quilts. We need to purchase batting, replace worn out cutting rulers, service and clean our machines. We always need Thread in neutral colors, light gray, cream, and white. We go through a lot of blades for the rotary cutters, and we need to replace a couple of cutting mats. We purchased a used laptop, a floppy and CD drive. We can now start using the embroidery software that came with our original group of sewing machines. Thank you so much for all your support. Come quilt with us!!!


