

MASS INTENTIONS

Mass intentions are a good way to remember and pray for your loved ones, alive or deceased. If you would like to request an intention please remember to submit your intentions for Liturgy ASAP by calling the parish office at 864.469.9119 or by email at <u>bill@saintrafka.org</u>. Please remember that it is rare to be able to have your intention the following Sunday! Masses are now generally booked up about three months in advance.

BAPTISM & CHRISMATION

Baptism in the Maronite Rite is always accompanied by *Chrismation* (Confirmation). Both Sacraments are given by a priest, and always in the same ceremony. Preparation to receive the Sacraments of Baptism and Chrismation is required. We encourage this to happen before the birth of your child. Please contact the <u>Church Office</u> for more details.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Anointing of the Sick is routinely offered during the Divine Liturgy on Wednesday evening and during pastoral visits by the priest to homebound and ill parishioners. Let me know if you will be in the hospital or have other special needs. Contact the <u>Church Office</u>.

THE MYSTERY OF CROWNING (MARRIAGE)

Couples must contact the pastor **at least** six months prior to the desired date of the wedding. To initiate the marriage preparation process or if you have questions for weddings taking place at Saint Rafka. Contact the <u>Church Office</u>.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Registration forms and welcome packets are available in the church office and the vestibule. Membership is a condition for the reception of the sacraments of baptism/confirmation, first reconciliation, first Eucharist, and Crowning (marriage). Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be sacramental sponsors. You must be a registered, contributing member for at least three months before a certificate is provided.

Scripture Readings

Isaiah 11:1-9

But a shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a bud shall blossom. The spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him: a spirit of wisdom and of understanding, A spirit of counsel and of strength, a spirit of knowledge and of fear of the LORD, and his delight shall be the fear of the LORD. Not by appearance shall he judge, nor by hearsay shall he decide, But he shall judge the poor with justice, and decided fairly for the land's afflicted. He shall strike the ruthless with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall slay the wicked. Justice shall be the band around his waist, and faithfulness a belt upon his hips. Then the wolf shall be a guest of the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the young goat; The calf and the young lion shall browse together, with a little child to guide them. The cow and the bear shall graze, together their young shall lie down; the lion shall eat hay like the ox. The baby shall play by the viper's den, and the child lay his hand on the adder's lair. They shall not harm or destroy on all my holy mountain; for the earth shall be filled with knowledge of the LORD, as water covers the sea.

Rom. 1:1-12

Paul, a slave of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle and set apart for the gospel of God, which he promised previously through his prophets in the holy scriptures, the gospel about his Son, descended from David according to the flesh, but established as Son of God in power according to the spirit of holiness through resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord. Through him we have received the grace of apostleship, to bring about the obedience of faith, for the sake of his name, among all the Gentiles, among whom are you also, who are called to belong to Jesus Christ; to all the beloved of God in Rome, called to be holy. Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

First, I give thanks to my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is heralded throughout the world. God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in proclaiming the gospel of his Son, that I remember you constantly, always asking in my prayers that somehow by God's will I may at last find my way clear to come to you. For I long to see you, that I may share with you some spiritual gift so that you may be strengthened, that is, that you and I may be mutually encouraged by one another's faith, yours and mine.

Matt 1:1-17

The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham. Abraham became the father of Isaac, Isaac the father of Iacob, Iacob the father of Judah and his brothers. Judah became the father of Perez and Zerah, whose mother was Tamar. Perez became the father of Hezron, Hezron the father of Ram, Ram the father of Amminadab. Amminadab became the father of Nahshon, Nahshon the father of Salmon, Salmon the father of Boaz, whose mother was Rahab. Boaz became the father of Obed, whose mother was Ruth. Obed became the father of lesse. lesse the father of David the king. David became the father of Solomon, whose mother had been the wife of Uriah. Solomon became the father of Rehoboam. Rehoboam the father of Abijah, Abijah the father of Asaph, Asaph became the father of Jehoshaphat, Jehoshaphat the father of Joram, Joram the father of Uzziah. Uzziah became the father of Jotham, Jotham the father of Ahaz, Ahaz the father of Hezekiah. Hezekiah became the father of Manasseh, Manasseh the father of Amos, Amos the father of Josiah. Josiah became the father of lechoniah and his brothers at the time of the Babylonian exile. After the Babylonian exile, Jechoniah became the father of Shealtiel, Shealtiel the father of Zerubbabel. Zerubbabel the father of Abiud. Abiud became the father of Eliakim, Eliakim the father of Azor, Azor the father of Zadok. Zadok became the father of Achim, Achim the father of Eliud, Eliud the father of Eleazar. Eleazar became the father of Matthan, Matthan the father of Jacob, Jacob the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary. Of her was born Jesus who is called the Messiah. Thus the total number of generations from

Abraham to David is fourteen generations from David to the Babylonian exile, fourteen generations; from the Babylonian exile to the Messiah, fourteen generations.

Reflection

On this Sunday we celebrate all the generations in the history of Israel that brought about the coming of the Lord – through faith – beginning with Abraham, and until Joseph the Father of Jesus.

In Matthew's Gospel, God's plan of salvation reflects the patience of God and his mercy towards our human nature, through both faith (trust and obedience), and sin (expressed in doubting). Saint Paul in his letter to the Romans reminds all nations – Jews and Greeks alike – how they have been included in God's saving plan. Now we all have become children of Abraham through faith like his own!

Our *Hoosoyo* this Sunday focuses on Christ, the *Eternally Begotten Son of God*, to be revealed as *the hidden mystery of God* to us and transfigured in God's proper time. Like the generations of the past – as a confirmation of our inclusion in this divine plan – the Church and her children now prepare for Christ's nativity – being eternally renewed and transfigured before us.

The *Qolo* and the *Mazmooro* hymns, dwell on the Cave of Bethlehem, where all creation has gathered to worship in wonder God's humble presence in their midst: *Emanuel (Hebrew: God among us)!* Like heaven, earth, has become God's dwelling place. All creatures now give praise to the Son of God who has become the Son of Man. He has made his nature one with ours; he has taken what is ours and made it his own. He has established his family with Mary and Joseph in our midst: the cribs in our churches reflect this so wonder-fully!

From now on both heavenly and earthly beings will stand forever stilled in awe at his gentle presence. Christ is our *Covenant of Grace* as we hand him down *from generation to generation*. He is carried by the angles and by the ark whose *two fiery wheels* are Joseph and Mary.

May the Wonder Child of Grace come to be your guest this Christmas! May you learn to open the doors of your hospitality forever wide!

During the dark of night, as the Church prays in her Office of Vigils – *lilyo* – she concludes this lengthy series of prayers and hymns with a set of psalms known as the *teshboohto* in Syriac or the *sajdi* in Arabic –literally, the "praises." This set of psalms (148-150) is a common part of Eastern Christian prayer. This set of psalms has at its core a central theme – the praise of God by all the things He has created: the sun, moon, stars, waters, earth, fire, hail rain, dew, mist, winds, mountains, hills, trees, beasts, tame animals, angels, saints, kings, rulers, old and young.

For centuries in parishes of the Maronite Church that might not have the ability to pray the lengthy midnight office before the Christmas liturgy, they preserved the practice of praying together these psalms before the liturgy. Like most Syriac hymnody, each verse is alternated between two groups. While one group is chanting a passage of the psalms, the other group is performing prostrations. This is a beautiful expression of Christian prayer – we simultaneously prostrate ourselves before God in our weakness, our sinfulness, and our humility and we stand boldly and with confidence before God to offer the praise and glory that is due to Him! These beautiful psalms exemplify a Christian understanding of the Incarnation and Christmas: because our God out of love for His creation chose of His own will to become man, He has reconciled Himself to all that He has made. As a result of this salvation and outpouring of humility and love on the part of our Creator, we, His creation, cry out with praise and glory – along with all of creation. We, along with the heavens and earth, skies and seas, fruits and trees, animals and beasts, angels, and saints, wonder at the Child of Wonder Who has come to visit His creation! Let everything that has breath praise the Lord!


Dear St. Rafka Community Members




MRE - Maronite Religious Education Classes


