MASS INTENTIONS

Mass intentions are a good way to remember and pray for your loved ones, alive or deceased. If you would like to request an intention please remember to submit your intentions for Liturgy ASAP by calling the parish office at 864.469.9119 or by email at secretary@saintrafka.org. Please remember that it is rare to be able to have your intention the following Sunday! Masses are now generally booked up about three months in advance.

BAPTISM & CHRISMATION

Baptism in the Maronite Rite is always accompanied by Chrismation (Confirmation). Both Sacraments are given by a priest, and always in the same ceremony. Preparation to receive the Sacraments of Baptism and Chrismation is required. We encourage this to happen before the birth of your child. Please contact the Church Office for more details.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Anointing of the Sick is routinely offered during the Divine Liturgy on Wednesday evening and during pastoral visits by the priest to homebound and ill parishioners. Let me know if you will be in the hospital or have other special needs. Contact the Church Office.

THE MYSTERY OF CROWNING (MARRIAGE)

Couples must contact the pastor **at least** six months prior to the desired date of the wedding. To initiate the marriage preparation process or if you have questions for weddings taking place at Saint Rafka. Contact the <u>Church Office</u>.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Registration forms and welcome packets are available in the church office and the vestibule. Membership is a condition for the reception of the sacraments of baptism/confirmation, first reconciliation, first Eucharist, and Crowning (marriage). Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be sacramental sponsors. You must be a registered, contributing member for at least three months before a certificate is provided.

Scripture Readings

1 Samuel 1:9-11; 19b-23

Hannah rose after one such meal at Shiloh, and presented herself before the LORD; at the time Eli the priest was sitting on a chair near the doorpost of the LORD's temple. In her bitterness she prayed to the LORD, weeping freely, and made this vow: "O LORD of hosts, if you look with pity on the hardship of your servant, if you remember me and do not forget me, if you give your handmaid a male child, I will give him to the LORD all the days of his life. No razor shall ever touch his head."

When they returned Elkanah had intercourse with his wife Hannah, and the LORD remembered her. She conceived and, at the end of her pregnancy, bore a son whom she named Samuel. "Because I asked the LORD for him." The next time her husband Elkanah was going up with the rest of his household to offer the customary sacrifice to the LORD and to fulfill his vows, Hannah did not go, explaining to her husband, "Once the child is weaned, I will take him to appear before the LORD and leave him there forever." Her husband Elkanah answered her: "Do what you think best; wait until you have weaned him. Only may the LORD fulfill his word!" And so she remained at home and nursed her son until she had weaned him.

Gal. 4:21-5:1

Tell me, you who want to be under the law, do you not listen to the law? For it is written that Abraham had two sons, one by the slave woman and the other by the freeborn woman. The son of the slave woman was born naturally, the son of the freeborn through a promise. Now this is an allegory. These women represent two covenants. One was from Mount Sinai, bearing children for slavery; this is Hagar. Hagar represents Sinai, a mountain in Arabia; it corresponds to the present Jerusalem, for she is in slavery along with her children. But the Jerusalem above is freeborn, and she is our mother. For it is written: "Rejoice, you barren one who bore no children; break forth and shout, you who were not in labor;

for more numerous are the children of the deserted one

than of her who has a husband."

Now you, brothers, like Isaac, are children of the promise. But just as then the child of the flesh persecuted the child of the spirit, it is the same now. But what does the scripture say? "Drive out the slave woman and her son! For the son of the slave woman shall not share the inheritance with the son"

of the freeborn. Therefore, brothers, we are children not of the slave woman but of the freeborn woman. For freedom Christ set us free; so stand firm and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery.

Luke 1:57-66

When the time arrived for Elizabeth to have her child she gave birth to a son. Her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had shown his great mercy toward her, and they rejoiced with her. When they came on the eighth day to circumcise the child, they were going to call him Zechariah after his father, but his mother said in reply, "No. He will be called John." But they answered her, "There is no one among your relatives who has this name." So they made signs, asking his father what he wished him to be called. He asked for a tablet and wrote, "John is his name," and all were amazed. Immediately his mouth was opened, his tongue freed, and he spoke blessing God. Then fear came upon all their neighbors, and all these matters were discussed throughout the hill country of Judea. All who heard these things took them to heart, saying, "What, then, will this child be?" For surely the hand of the Lord was with him.

Reflection

On this Sunday, the Church and her children, join with Zechariah and Elizabeth to celebrate the birth of the St. John the Baptist with songs of joy, praise and thanksgiving. The *Song of Zechariah* (his name means: God has remembered) in the Gospel of Saint Luke the evangelist, celebrates the fulfillment of God's promises made long ago, his kindness, and his compassion. While it is a personal song of joy for the birth of a child, it now has become a universal song of salvation on behalf of all humanity.

Also, the letter of St. Paul to the Galatians, reminds us of the past promises God had made to Abraham and his nomadic people and the signs that accompanied them as barren women become pregnant. The Gospel of Luke shows Elizabeth – like Sara, the aged wife of Abraham – rejoicing in the Lord at the birth of her unexpected son John (his name means in Hebrew: God is gracious). She and Zechariah, now rejoice in God's plan of salvation, by dedicating their son to God's will.

In Semitic religious traditions names have meaning and purpose; the name "John" (Youhanan in Hebrew) means: "God is kind and gracious." Thus, the child John, will grow to become an expression of that graciousness poured out in the form of forgiveness of sins by the river Jordan – the first baptismal fountain! Like John we too are called to become forerunners for Christ in our world by ourselves becoming expressions of God's forgiveness and grace.


The Church, joins on this Jubilee of the Birth of the Forerunner of the Lord, "the infant of grace" – who makes straight his paths – revealing the graciousness of God for his people. In the Hoosoyo she recollects this astonishing birth with praise and thanksgiving that extend throughout infinity. She draws her children to listen attentively to the announcement of the Baptizer made at his birth, and later by him by the river Jordan.

From the birth of John we look mystically forward to the birth of the Beloved Son of God: "like people awaiting a new dawn and like a ship

whose watchman has seen the land"! We behold this as the sign and expression of God's fatherly loving-care towards us and all of his creation. It is so fitting, therefore, to follow this remembrance of the graciousness of God liturgically with the tree-time holy praises of the Trinity: "Qadeeshat Aloho"!

Let us move on to show our thanksgiving by praying together the living Creed: the *gift of faith*, the *remembrance of love*, and the *expression of Christian joy*. Like this holy child of joy, John, whose name is only a reminder of God's infinite mercy, now we offer our faith, handed down from one generation to another, as the hope for the ages!

So, just to be clear and to reiterate what is published in our Eparchial calendar, we will celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception on Sunday, December 8, along with the Sunday of the Birth of John the Baptist." Thus, there will be no public liturgy on December 9 of this feast.

Thanks to all who prepared food for the **Potluck Luncheon** last Sunday. The food and fellowship were wonderful and it was a nice way to end the Thanksgiving weekend. Now we are back to reality as we prepare for Christmas.



What Has Prayers and Squares Been Doing?

We make quilts! But we do other things also. We make prayer squares(small quilts) for the Neonatal Intensive care unit, as well as angel gowns and pouches for micro preemies through full term babies. At a time of such intense grief a parent needs to be able to say goodbye with some dignity. We have been sharing fabric with other catholic groups who are sewing for charity. We had an abundance of military fabrics, so we shared with a group that makes pillow cases for the veterans home. We donated enough fabric to get another church started with making quilts for the children's hospital. We have shared children's fabric with a group that makes quilts for the Ronald McDonald House. We also share fabric that goes to quilts made for Steps to Hope(a battered women and children's shelter). We use our long arm machine to quilt tops that have been made for Steps to Hope, and the Ronald McDonald house. We are Busy!!!

If you are facing physical, spiritual, or other life challenges, please request a prayer quilt. We want to wrap you in the comfort of God and the prayers of the church. Your name can remain private if you wish. We would love to give a quilt for every new baby born into the Saint Rafka church Family. Please let us know if you are expecting. Any church member who joins the military is also eligible for a quilt and a prayer square for the inside of their helmet. All you need to do is call the office with the name, and the prayers requested.

We need help. Come and sew with us on Tuesdays from 10 am to 2 pm. If you don't know how to sew, we are happy to teach you, we also have extra machines we can loan. Are you busy and can't come on Tuesdays? No worries, we have quilt kits that are ready to sew, and you can sew at home. We can make it work. If you prefer hand work, we need ties placed in quilts and labels sewn on.

We were blessed by a HUGE donation from Walmart this year. We got 600 bolts(2 pallets) of fabric from them. They are no longer selling fabric from bolts, and donated all the stock to us. What an amazing blessing! We also keep our eye out for estate sales. That is where all the military fabric came from. We got a lot of children's fabric from a friend who was downsizing. We are always happy to accept donations of cotton fabric suitable for making quilts. We need to purchase batting, replace worn out cutting rulers, service and clean our machines. We always need Thread in neutral colors, light gray, cream, and white. We go through a lot of blades for the rotary cutters, and we need to replace a couple of cutting mats. We purchased a used laptop, a floppy and CD drive. We can now start using the embroidery software that came with our original group of sewing machines. Thank you so much for all your support. Come quilt with us!!!






