MASS INTENTIONS

Mass intentions are a good way to remember and pray for your loved ones, alive or deceased. If you would like to request an intention please remember to submit your intentions for Liturgy ASAP by calling the parish office at 864.469.9119 or by email at secretary@saintrafka.org. Please remember that it is rare to be able to have your intention the following Sunday! Masses are now generally booked up about three months in advance.

BAPTISM & CHRISMATION

Baptism in the Maronite Rite is always accompanied by Chrismation (Confirmation). Both Sacraments are given by a priest, and always in the same ceremony. Preparation to receive the Sacraments of Baptism and Chrismation is required. We encourage this to happen before the birth of your child. Please contact the Church Office for more details.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Anointing of the Sick is routinely offered during the Divine Liturgy on Wednesday evening and during pastoral visits by the priest to homebound and ill parishioners. Let me know if you will be in the hospital or have other special needs. Contact the Church Office.

THE MYSTERY OF CROWNING (MARRIAGE)

Couples must contact the pastor **at least** six months prior to the desired date of the wedding. To initiate the marriage preparation process or if you have questions for weddings taking place at Saint Rafka. Contact the <u>Church Office</u>.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Registration forms and welcome packets are available in the church office and the vestibule. Membership is a condition for the reception of the sacraments of baptism/confirmation, first reconciliation, first Eucharist, and Crowning (marriage). Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be sacramental sponsors. You must be a registered, contributing member for at least three months before a certificate is provided.

In him we were also chosen, destined in accord with the purpose of the One who accomplishes all things according to the intention of his will, so that we might exist for the praise of his glory, we who first hoped in Christ. In him you also, who have heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and have believed in him, were sealed with the promised holy Spirit, which is the first installment of our inheritance toward redemption as God's possession, to the praise of his glory.

uring those days Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."

Reflection

On this Sunday of the Season of Announcements, we have a joyful celebration of our belonging to the divine fatherhood and motherhood of God in the Most Holy Trinity. The divine fatherhood is beautifully expressed by St. Paul in the image of the loving God, our Father, and his plan of salvation through his beloved Son Jesus. Saint Paul in this hymn of blessings – in his letter to the Ephesians – emphasizes the blessings of the Father that we have all received in Christ Jesus through the gift of the Holy Spirit.

In the Gospel, St. Luke, portrays for us the motherhood of the Holy Spirit who is about to give a new birth to the new creation – revealed in the holy pregnancies of Mary and Elizabeth. By God's grace both heaven and earth are pregnant now with Christ and the Holy Spirit! It is with this Spirit that both Mary and Elizabeth are filled and rejoice.

In our Syriac (Christian Aramaic) baptismal tradition, the *Holy Spirit* is often portrayed as the *divine mother* who gives life eternal to her children. In the Gospel Jesus reminds us that it is not enough to be born of our natural mothers alone but we need to be born anew by the Holy Spirit. (Jn3:6).

On this Sunday, the Church and her children, as on a contemplative pilgrim-journey travel with Mary on her way to Elizabeth, ascending to the mountain hills of Judea. At the start of the journey we hear sounds of praise and rejoicing in *Mary's song*: "My spirit rejoices in the Lord..God my savior", which in turn echoes the ancient song of Hanna (1Samuel:2), as well as the psalms, and the prophets. This has now become our song, for our journey!

In the first Qolo prayer, like Elizabeth (whose name means: God's fulfillment), we recognize Mary as the dwelling abode of divinity and call her "the new heaven filled with the glorious Sun", Christ the Lord! The Opening Prayer, welcomes the Lord – whom Elizabeth saw in Mary's eyes –

and who now comes to abide among us through the eyes of faith!

In the next prayer, Mary (her name Maryam in Hebrew means: Lord of the Sea) is called the new "temple" – in the waters of whose womb Christ concealed his power – and who now joins heaven with earth. Then, in the Sedro prayer, Mary's womb, becoming like the ark, carries Christ on this upward journey, and brings him to Elizabeth, confirming the salvation that she has anticipated by the miraculous birth of her son John.

As Mary ascends the hillsides of Judea, the Church is reminded of the mountains of the Lord where God dwelt in ancient times. As his people ascended the mountain to gaze upon him and worship him so now we are about to ascend to his altar, to receive *Christ* – the "Fruit of the Virgin's womb!"

Listen to the prayer of St. Ephrem:
Fire and Holy Spirit in the womb
that bore you.
Fire and Holy Spirit in our baptism.
And in the Bread the Cup fire
and Holy Spirit!

In the second Qolo, the Church continues to rejoice with Mary and Elizabeth along with the patriarchs and the prophets of old: for he has "remembered" his promises in his "mercy!" At the Etro prayer, the Church (with Mary and Elizabeth) having ascended to the summit now asks the Lord to establish his peace among her children, and with the faithful departed, as well as among all peoples and nations.

Finally, in the Mazmooro hymn, as we are about to hear (receive) the Word of God, we welcome Mary "the daughter of David and the Mother of the Lord" in whom all his promises has been fulfilled. And as she hands her son – the Word of God – over to us, through the priest who is about to proclaim the Gospel, we say to her and to her son: "To Bashlom / Come in Peace!"

May Mary's Peace, Christ, come to your home in this holy season; and may he remain always with you.


