MASS INTENTIONS

Mass intentions are a good way to remember and pray for your loved ones, alive or deceased. If you would like to request an intention please remember to submit your intentions for Liturgy ASAP by calling the parish office at 864.469.9119 or by email at <u>bill@saintrafka.org</u>. Please remember that it is rare to be able to have your intention the following Sunday! Masses are now generally booked up about three months in advance.

BAPTISM & CHRISMATION

Baptism in the Maronite Rite is always accompanied by *Chrismation* (Confirmation). Both Sacraments are given by a priest, and always in the same ceremony. Preparation to receive the Sacraments of Baptism and Chrismation is required. We encourage this to happen before the birth of your child. Please contact the <u>Church Office</u> for more details.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Anointing of the Sick is routinely offered during the Divine Liturgy on Wednesday evening and during pastoral visits by the priest to homebound and ill parishioners. Let me know if you will be in the hospital or have other special needs. Contact the <u>Church Office</u>.

THE MYSTERY OF CROWNING (MARRIAGE)

Couples must contact the pastor **at least** six months prior to the desired date of the wedding. To initiate the marriage preparation process or if you have questions for weddings taking place at Saint Rafka. Contact the <u>Church Office</u>.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Registration forms and welcome packets are available in the church office and the vestibule. Membership is a condition for the reception of the sacraments of baptism/confirmation, first reconciliation, first Eucharist, and Crowning (marriage). Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be sacramental sponsors. You must be a registered, contributing member for at least three months before a certificate is provided.

Scripture Readings

John 1:35-42

Jeremiah 1:4-10

The word of the LORD came to me: Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you. "Ah, Lord GOD!" I said, "I do not know how to speak. I am too young!" But theLORD answered me, Do not say, "I am too young." To whomever I send you, you shall go; whatever I command you, you shall speak. Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you to deliver you—oracle of the LORD.

Then the LORD extended his hand and touched my mouth, saying to me, See, I place my words in your mouth! Today I appoint you over nations and over kingdoms, To uproot and to tear down, to destroy and to demolish, to build and to plant.

2 Cor. 4:5-15

For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness', who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you. But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture 'I believed, and so I spoke' we also believe, and so we speak, because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, 'Look, here is the Lamb of God! ' The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi' (which translated means Teacher), 'where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come and see.' They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas' (which is translated Peter).



Reflection

This Sunday we continue to celebrate the Light of Christ – that we carry in our hearts and share with the world – through our actions as *Children of the Light*. The Psalmist King David proclaims with joy: "Your word", O Lord, "is lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Ps.119:105). Little did he expect that someday God would respond by making his *Word* incarnate – letting his light be reflected from *the face of Jesus*, radiating his divine peace and joy on us! Can we really *believe* that God would do this? This is the theme of today's gospel message from St. John; the challenge of our faith!

Saint Paul, in his epistle declares: *God has shown in our hearts* that we may reflect the glory of Christ in our world. How awesome is this action of the divine Trinity: that we have been chosen to become a mirror reflection of Christ to the world! Now Christ's Incarnation has extended its grace from *Mary* over to *us*. Saint Ephrem, in his poem meditations, images Mary – the Mother of Christ – for us as model carrier, and pure reflection of her son's incarnate light.

And now, in *us* too, Saint Paul reminds us, shines that light of Christ: "to bring to light the knowledge of the glory of God on the face of Jesus Christ!" This is a treasure, he explains, that we hold in earthen vessels: through our feeble human nature – so that in *us* too the power of God may manifest itself as that divine gentleness and compassion – reflecting upon us from the face of the *God's Beloved Son: Jesus*!

In our Hymn of Light of Saint Ephrem, the Church, like Mary, proclaims Jesus our Risen Lord, as: the Light of the just and the upright, who came to rescue us from darkness and to fill us with the radiance of his light!

In our sinful world today, it is not so easy to face the poor and powerless Jesus, and still *believe* in the power of God. Yet, God's power shines through the gentleness, mercy, and kindness of his beloved Son, who has come into the world not to judge it, but to elicit human compassion; that he may re-fashion us into the image of his heavenly and merciful Father; that we too may have a share in his Kingdom of Light.

Jesus would often tell his followers not to hide their light under a stand, but to hold it up, so that others may also see it reflected in them! And now may the light from Jesus' face – as from this altar – continue to shine on us and through us. May it be reflected through our hearts, goodness, and our compassion for others. And because of us, *may the Church continue to be the Light of Christ for the world* – as we too like the Psalmist David pray and wish it so through the prayer of the priest at the completion of our Altar Celebration.

St. Ephrem the Syrian writes beautifully in his Hymn on Epiphany, No. 8 concerning the Baptism of our Lord. St. Ephrem views the baptism of Christ in the water as analogous to the divine presence in the womb of Mary and therefore as the means by which we are "divinized" or made to partake in the divine nature. Also, using Moses as an example, he claims that just as God in his mercy limited Himself in coming to Moses, He does the same for feeble human beings. "God in His love stooped and came down, to mingle His love with the waters, and to unite the nature of His majesty with the weak bodies of humans. By means of the waters he found a way to come own and to dwell among us; like to the way of love He came down and dwelt in the womb. O the love of God Who seeks for Himself all occasions to dwell among us!

He stooped and came down to the cave in Horeb, and He extended His shadow of His majesty on Moses; He mixed His glorious splendor to a mortal. There was therein a figure of Baptism: For He came down to dwell in it, in the water he had tempered the might of His majesty, that He may dwell among the infirm. On Moses dwelt the Breath, and on you the plentitude of Christ. That might then none could endure; not Moses chief of deliverers, nor Elijah chief of zealots; and the Seraphim too veil their faces, for it is the might that subdues all. His love mingled gentleness in the water and the oil; that humanity in its weakness might be able to stand before Him when covered by the water and the oil."

May Christ, baptized by John, renew our hearts and minds as we commemorate the sanctification of water and oil by which we receive Holy Baptism and Chrismation.




