

MASS INTENTIONS

Mass intentions are a good way to remember and pray for your loved ones, alive or deceased. If you would like to request an intention please remember to submit your intentions for Liturgy ASAP by calling the parish office at 864.469.9119 or by email at bill@saintrafka.org. Please remember that it is rare to be able to have your intention the following Sunday! Masses are now generally booked up about three months in advance.

BAPTISM & CHRISMATION

Baptism in the Maronite Rite is always accompanied by *Chrismation* (Confirmation). Both Sacraments are given by a priest, and always in the same ceremony. Preparation to receive the Sacraments of Baptism and Chrismation is required. We encourage this to happen before the birth of your child. Please contact the Church Office for more details.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Anointing of the Sick is routinely offered during the Divine Liturgy on Wednesday evening and during pastoral visits by the priest to homebound and ill parishioners. Let me know if you will be in the hospital or have other special needs. Contact the Church Office.

THE MYSTERY OF CROWNING (MARRIAGE)

Couples must contact the pastor **at least** six months prior to the desired date of the wedding. To initiate the marriage preparation process or if you have questions for weddings taking place at Saint Rafka. Contact the **Church Office**.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Registration forms and welcome packets are available in the church office and the vestibule. Membership is a condition for the reception of the sacraments of baptism/confirmation, first reconciliation, first Eucharist, and Crowning (marriage). Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be sacramental sponsors. You must be a registered, contributing member for at least three months before a certificate is provided.

Scripture Readings

I Kings 3:5-7, 9-12, 14

In Gibeon the LORD appeared to Solomon in a dream at night. God said: Whatever you ask I shall give you. Solomon answered: "You have shown great kindness to your servant, David my father, because he walked before you with fidelity, justice, and an upright heart; and you have continued this great kindness toward him today, giving him a son to sit upon his throne. Now, LORD, my God, you have made me, your servant, king to succeed David my father; but I am a mere youth, not knowing at all how to act. Give your servant, therefore, a listening heart to judge your people and to distinguish between good and evil. For who is able to give judgment for this vast people of yours?" The Lord was pleased by Solomon's request. So God said to him: Because you asked for this—you did not ask for a long life for yourself, nor for riches, nor for the life of your enemies—but you asked for discernment to know what is right—I now do as you request. I give you a heart so wise and discerning that there has never been anyone like you until now, nor after you will there be anyone to equal you. And if you walk in my ways, keeping my statutes and commandments, as David your father did, I will give you a long life.

Heb. 7:11-19

If, then, perfection came through the levitical priesthood, on the basis of which the people received the law, what need would there still have been for another priest to arise according to the order of Melchizedek, and not reckoned according to the order of Aaron? When there is a change of priesthood, there is necessarily a change of law as well. Now he of whom these things are said belonged to a different tribe, of which no member ever officiated at the altar. It is clear that our Lord arose from Judah, and in regard to that tribe Moses said nothing about priests. It is even more obvious if another priest is raised up after the likeness of Melchizedek, who has become so, not by a law expressed in a commandment concerning physical descent but by the power of a life that cannot be destroyed. For it is testified: "You are a priest forever

according to the order of Melchizedek." On the one hand, a former commandment is annulled because of its weakness and uselessness, for the law brought nothing to perfection; on the other hand, a better hope is introduced, through which we draw near to God.

Luke 2:41-52

ach year his parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve vears old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart.-And Jesus advanced [in] wisdom and age and favor before God and man.



Reflection

Today we are looking through the lens of St. Luke's Gospel at yet another icon of the Holy Family. This Lukan portrait of young Jesus carries with it elements of both Christian peace and tension.

At the temple, we get the sense that Jesus (Yeshua), is an exceptional child as he argues with the wise teachers. He is specially gifted for his age in intelligence, wisdom, and yet also, he is rebellious and non-conformist. In some ways Jesus is a typical young teen with emerging independent qualities. He has already begun to depart some ways from his family – this is expressed in him not following on the trail back with Joseph, Mary, and the others – but staying behind in Jerusalem.

We might also get the sense from this Gospel of Luke that there are occasional tensions in the Holy Family – Jesus is not an easy child for his parents. At the high point of his argument with his mother he lets her know that he belongs to a higher parent to whom he holds greater



obedience! Mary, humbly listens with an open mind and heart, wondering what this all means, and what God has in plan this growing son of hers.

Our prayers this Sunday reflect the wisdom of the Syrian Fathers of our Church as they contemplate these Gospel mysteries. The *Hoosoyo* prayers ask Christ Jesus to teach us his ways – that we too, may choose wisely in all things and follow always his commandment of love in true obedience to God our Father – who loves humanity and fills us with his light.

And like Jesus, who follows the one true way, our Church Fathers, also ask for themselves and their children, that in all things we may follow the one true way, and never veer off from it. They ask the Lord to let his Gospel be "a beacon and light and harbor" for his Church and her children: "Let our hearts know true happiness, which is based on pleasing you and doing your will".

Let us therefore be attentive, like Mary, in all that we say and do as we journey-on the way with Christ; that in all our actions, the true light of Christ's Gospel – the Word and will of the Father – my shine forth in our world. And that with us, and through us, Christ, may be known as the ever-flowing grace and compassion of God – the Heavenly Father of all people.

O Jesus, born from David's daughter, fill us with the light of your wisdom and your grace!

We witnessed senseless violence against innocent people in the name of terrorism. Thankfully no one from my family was near the area or injured, the majority of the victims were tourists to the city enjoying the New Year festivities. Let us pray for the softening of the hearts of those who would commit violence against innocent victims.

I want to thank all who brought food and drink for **Father Toni's** farewell luncheon last Sunday. It was a very nice affair. There was also a small reception after the 4 PM vigil liturgy that was well attended. Father Toni will be greatly missed but he will do great work at his new assignment at Saint Anthony's.

Sadly, several community members have lost loved ones during the Christmas season. The oldest sister of Marie Kidd, +Virginia C. Guzman, died early in the morning of Christmas Eve. 
