MASS INTENTIONS

Mass intentions are a good way to remember and pray for your loved ones, alive or deceased. If you would like to request an intention please remember to submit your intentions for Liturgy ASAP by calling the parish office at 864.469.9119 or by email at <u>secretary@saintrafka.org</u>. Please remember that it is rare to be able to have your intention the following Sunday! Masses are now generally booked up about three months in advance.

BAPTISM & CHRISMATION

Baptism in the Maronite Rite is always accompanied by Chrismation (Confirmation). Both Sacraments are given by a priest, and always in the same ceremony. Preparation to receive the Sacraments of Baptism and Chrismation is required. We encourage this to happen before the birth of your child. Please contact the <u>Church Office</u> for more details.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Anointing of the Sick is routinely offered during the Divine Liturgy on Wednesday evening and during pastoral visits by the priest to homebound and ill parishioners. Let me know if you will be in the hospital or have other special needs. Contact the <u>Church Office</u>.

THE MYSTERY OF CROWNING (MARRIAGE)

Couples must contact the pastor **at least** six months prior to the desired date of the wedding. To initiate the marriage preparation process or if you have questions for weddings taking place at Saint Rafka. Contact the <u>Church Office</u>.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Registration forms and welcome packets are available in the church office and the vestibule. Membership is a condition for the reception of the sacraments of baptism/confirmation, first reconciliation, first Eucharist, and Crowning (marriage). Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be sacramental sponsors. You must be a registered, contributing member for at least three months before a certificate is provided.

Scripture Readings

Isaiah 61:1-4; 8-11

The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; He has sent me to bring good news to the afflicted, to bind up the brokenhearted, To proclaim liberty to the captives, release to the prisoners, To announce a year of favor from the LORD and a day of vindication by our God; To comfort all who mourn; to place on those who mourn in Zion a diadem instead of ashes, To give them oil of gladness instead of mourning, a glorious mantle instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of justice, the planting of the LORD to show his glory. They shall rebuild the ancient ruins, the former wastes they shall raise up And restore the desolate cities, devastations of generation upon generation. For I, the LORD, love justice, I hate robbery and wrongdoing; I will faithfully give them their recompense, an everlasting covenant I will make with them. Their offspring shall be renowned among the nations, and their descendants in the midst of the peoples; All who see them shall acknowledge them: "They are offspring the LORD has blessed." I will rejoice heartily in the LORD, my being exults in my God; For he has clothed me with garments of salvation, and wrapped me in a robe of justice, Like a bridegroom adorned with a diadem, as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. As the earth brings forth its shoots, and a garden makes its seeds spring up, So will the Lord GOD make justice spring up, and praise before all the nations.

Il Corinthians 5:20 - 6-10 So we are ambassadors for Christ, as if God were appealing through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him. Working together, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. For he says: "In an acceptable time<u>*</u> I heard you, and on the day of salvation I helped you." Behold, now is a very acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. We cause no one to stumble<u>*</u> in anything, in order that no fault may be found with our ministry; on the contrary, in everything we commend ourselves as ministers of God, through much endurance,[±] in afflictions, hardships, constraints, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, vigils, fasts; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, in a holy spirit, in unfeigned love, in truthful speech, in the power of God; with weapons of righteousness at the right and at the left; through glory and dishonor, insult and praise. We are treated as deceivers and yet are truthful; as unrecognized and yet acknowledged; as dying and behold we live; as chastised and yet not put to death; as sorrowful yet always rejoicing; as poor yet enriching many; as having nothing and yet possessing all things.

Luke 4: 14 - 21

esus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread[±]throughout the whole region He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all. He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord." Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them, "Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

Reflection

"Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing," our Lord tells us. What our Lord refers to is a prophecy from Isaiah that the Father sent Him to proclaim good news to the poor, bring freedom to prisoners, recover the sight of the blind and liberate the oppressed (Is. 61:1,2). These are quite remarkable objectives our Lord says have been fulfilled in our hearing. But though He says they have been fulfilled, we are still saddled with all the burdens of our life. What kind of good news and freedom has liberated us if we still endure the misery and constraint of the same old?

The Old Testament, as recorded by the prophets, often had an immediate historical meaning. In the case of Isaiah, he spoke for God promising the Jews that they would be returned to the Holy Land from their forced exile and deportation to far Eastern lands. But God did not simply wish to speak to the exiles of that short time through Isaiah, but all who suffer the more serious and permanent exile and enslavement under sin and death. If the Old Testament was purely historical and literal, we would not read it today. But the word was revealed to prepare all for the coming of the fulfillment of all: the Word God, Jesus Christ.

When Christ says He has come to announce good news to the poor and liberate the oppressed, it is clearly understood in a different way from those who listened to Isaiah centuries before. Christ came to free us as prisoners of Satan and break the shackles of death. To His enemies, it seemed He was defeated Himself – He was publicly beaten and executed. But He descended to the dead to liberate them, and by His Mysteries, He has given us life.

The Scriptures He has given us, both through the prophets in the Old Testament and the evangelists and Apostles in the New Testament, prepare us once again for the Coming of the Lord. They are our means of knowing the liberation and freedom that Christ has granted us by His life-giving life, death and resurrection. As St. Ephrem explains, Scripture is an inexhaustible fountain, which quenches the thirst of the soul. We should return to it again and again like water – never would we stop drinking water simply because we are tired of drinking for we need it to live. Likewise, the Scriptures are so rich the wealth of revelation can never be fully comprehended, yet repeated use of it brings about life and health of the soul.

Fulfilled in our hearing of the Scriptures is the reception of our good news, freedom, healing and liberation, which Christ brought us by His coming. We have the means to these in reading the Sacred Scriptures. Each book of Scripture is like a piece of armor - one a shield, one a sword, one a helmet, one a breastplate, and the like. One would not go into battle without armor, and likewise one should not enter the conflict of the world without Scripture, often polished and sharpened by daily reading. Of course, one can misuse armor – if one puts a helmet on one's foot, it not only does not work, but would probably be a hindrance. Likewise, Scripture does have proper interpretation. Not only has God sent us His revelation through the saintly prophets, evangelists and apostles, but also the means to interpret them in the Church – the great fathers, such as Ephrem the Syrian, Jacob of Sarug, Origen, and John Chrysostom. Wonderful places to begin are Ephrem's Commentary on Genesis or Jacob's many homilies on the Gospel.

If we neglect the Scriptures, we neglect what Christ has wished to reveal to us about Himself throughout thousands of years of revelation. But if we listen to them attentively, we shall find the good news and liberation which Christ Jesus has promised us.


