MASS INTENTIONS

Mass intentions are a good way to remember and pray for your loved ones, alive or deceased. If you would like to request an intention please remember to submit your intentions for Liturgy ASAP by calling the parish office at 864.469.9119 or by email at bill@saintrafka.org. Please remember that it is rare to be able to have your intention the following Sunday! Masses are now generally booked up about three months in advance.

BAPTISM & CHRISMATION

Baptism in the Maronite Rite is always accompanied by *Chrismation* (Confirmation). Both Sacraments are given by a priest, and always in the same ceremony. Preparation to receive the Sacraments of Baptism and Chrismation is required. We encourage this to happen before the birth of your child. Please contact the Church Office for more details.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Anointing of the Sick is routinely offered during the Divine Liturgy on Wednesday evening and during pastoral visits by the priest to homebound and ill parishioners. Let me know if you will be in the hospital or have other special needs. Contact the Church Office.

THE MYSTERY OF CROWNING (MARRIAGE)

Couples must contact the pastor **at least** six months prior to the desired date of the wedding. To initiate the marriage preparation process or if you have questions for weddings taking place at Saint Rafka. Contact the **Church Office**.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Registration forms and welcome packets are available in the church office and the vestibule. Membership is a condition for the reception of the sacraments of baptism/confirmation, first reconciliation, first Eucharist, and Crowning (marriage). Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be sacramental sponsors. You must be a registered, contributing member for at least three months before a certificate is provided.

Scripture Readings

Numbers 15:37-41

The LORD said to Moses: Speak to the Israelites and tell them that throughout their generations they are to make tassels for the corners of their garments, fastening a violet cord to each corner. When you use these tassels, the sight of the cord will remind you of all the commandments of the LORD and you will do them, without prostituting yourself going after the desires of your hearts and your eyes.

Thus you will remember to do all my commandments and you will be holy to your God. I, the LORD, am your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt to be your God: I, the LORD your God.

2 Cor. 7: 4-11

I have great confidence in you, I have great pride in you; I am filled with encouragement, I am overflowing with joy all the more because of all our affliction. For even when we came into Macedonia, our flesh had no rest, but we were afflicted in every way—external conflicts, internal fears. But God, who encourages the downcast, encouraged us by the arrival of Titus, and not only by his arrival but also by the encouragement with which he was encouraged in regard to you, as he told us of your yearning, your lament, your zeal for me, so that I rejoiced even more. For even if I saddened you by my letter, I do not regret it; and if I did regret it ([for] I see that that letter saddened you, if only for a while), I rejoice now, not because you were saddened, but because you were saddened into repentance; for you were saddened in a godly way, so that you did not suffer loss in anything because of us. For godly sorrow produces a salutary repentance without regret, but worldly sorrow produces death. For behold what earnestness this godly sorrow has produced for you, as well as readiness for a defense, and indignation, and fear, and yearning, and zeal, and punishment. In every way you have shown yourselves to be innocent in the matter.

hen Jesus returned, the crowd welcomed him, for they were all waiting for him. And a man named Jairus, an official of the synagogue, came forward. He fell at the feet of Jesus and begged him to come to his house, because he had an only daughter, about twelve years old, and she was dying. As he went, the crowds almost crushed him. And a woman afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years, who [had spent her whole livelihood on doctors and] was unable to be cured by anyone, came up behind him and touched the tassel on his cloak. Immediately her bleeding stopped. Jesus then asked, "Who touched me?" While all were denying it, Peter said, "Master, the crowds are pushing and pressing in upon you." But Jesus said, "Someone has touched me; for I know that power has gone out from me." When the woman realized that she had not escaped notice, she came forward trembling. Falling down before him, she explained in the presence of all the people why she had touched him and how she had been healed immediately. He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you; go in peace." While he was still speaking, someone from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter is dead; do not trouble the teacher any longer." On hearing this, Jesus answered him, "Do not be afraid; just have faith and she will be saved." When he arrived at the house he allowed no one to enter with him except Peter and John and James, and the child's father and mother. All were weeping and mourning for her, when he said, "Do not weep any longer, for she is not dead, but sleeping." And they ridiculed him, because they knew that she was dead. But he took her by the hand and called to her, "Child, arise!" Her breath returned and she immediately arose. He then directed that she should be given something to eat. Her parents were astounded, and he instructed them to tell no one what had happened.

Reflection

On this Sunday the Lord Jesus is again revealed to us as the *Divine Physician* of both our souls and bodies. He can raise-up the dead as well as heal our sicknesses. The Church, in her prayers, implores Jesus to pour the balm of his mercy on both the sick and the sorrowful so they may all benefit from the tremendous power his healing compassion.

Luke's Gospel vividly portrays the compassion and gentleness of Jesus in his dealing with the two women in need and their families. The case of the hemorrhaging woman becomes a lesson for all of us; to seek the Lord and not to be afraid to come before him for mercy and healing; nor to be intimidated by the crowds and their opinions. The courage of this woman is praised by St. Ephrem and other Church Fathers who present her as a model – for each one of us to have this courage – to admit that we are in need of healing – to be bold enough to touch the Lord – and to let him act graciously towards us.

Lent is the Season when the Church draws heavily on the sacramental-mysteries (tassels) of Christ. She encourages us and to confess ourselves as sinners who often have not lived by the Lord's commandments of love: expressed in patience, tolerance, generosity, and mercifulness towards others – and even towards ourselves. How wonderful it is to hear the words thereafter: *go in peace, your sins have been forgiven*; or, *Be healed!* There our shackles are removed as the Lord takes upon himself our burdens and makes them light as he says (Mt 11: 28-30):

Come to me all you who are
weary and burdened,
and I will give you rest.
Take my yoke upon you and learn from me,
for I am gentle and humble of heart,
and you will find rest for your souls.
For my yoke is easy,
and my burden is light!

Like the young girl to whom Jesus says "Arise / Qoom" so too to our inner being (our souls) fallen asleep with the burdens of sadness, discouragement, and disbelief he will say: "Qoom / Arise!"

May the Lord visit you this lent and bring you healing of his passion and resurrection! May you drink from the cup of his compassion! May you have the courage to touch his tassel for healing and help!

May he let his light and love shine from within you this Easter so that you may cry-out from the inner cave of your heart and proclaim with faith: "Truly He is Risen!"


The Servants of Mary and Joseph Lay Carmelite Community




