

MASS INTENTIONS

Mass intentions are a good way to remember and pray for your loved ones, alive or deceased. If you would like to request an intention please remember to submit your intentions for Liturgy ASAP by calling the parish office at 864.469.9119 or by email at bill@saintrafka.org. Please remember that it is rare to be able to have your intention the following Sunday! Masses are now generally booked up about three months in advance.

BAPTISM & CHRISMATION

Baptism in the Maronite Rite is always accompanied by *Chrismation* (Confirmation). Both Sacraments are given by a priest, and always in the same ceremony. Preparation to receive the Sacraments of Baptism and Chrismation is required. We encourage this to happen before the birth of your child. Please contact the Church Office for more details.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Anointing of the Sick is routinely offered during the Divine Liturgy on Wednesday evening and during pastoral visits by the priest to homebound and ill parishioners. Let me know if you will be in the hospital or have other special needs. Contact the Church Office.

THE MYSTERY OF CROWNING (MARRIAGE)

Couples must contact the pastor **at least** six months prior to the desired date of the wedding. To initiate the marriage preparation process or if you have questions for weddings taking place at Saint Rafka. Contact the **Church Office**.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Registration forms and welcome packets are available in the church office and the vestibule. Membership is a condition for the reception of the sacraments of baptism/confirmation, first reconciliation, first Eucharist, and Crowning (marriage). Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be sacramental sponsors. You must be a registered, contributing member for at least three months before a certificate is provided.

Scripture Readings

Isaiah 55:1-13

All you who are thirsty, come to the water! You who have no money, come, buy grain and eat; Come, buy grain without money, wine and milk without cost! Why spend your money for what is not bread; your wages for what does not satisfy? Only listen to me, and you shall eat well, you shall delight in rich fare. Pay attention and come to me; listen, that you may have life. I will make with you an everlasting covenant, the steadfast loyalty promised to David. As I made him a witness to peoples, a leader and commander of peoples, So shall you summon a nation you knew not, and a nation that knew you not shall run to you, Because of the LORD, your God, the Holy One of Israel, who has glorified you. Seek the LORD while he may be found, call upon him while he is near. Let the wicked forsake their way, and sinners their thoughts; Let them turn to the LORD to find mercy; to our God, who is generous in forgiving. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways oracle of the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, my thoughts higher than your thoughts. Yet just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down And do not return there till they have watered the earth, making it fertile and fruitful, Giving seed to the one who sows and bread to the one who eats, So shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth; It shall not return to me empty, but shall do what pleases me, achieving the end for which I sent it. Yes, in joy you shall go forth, in peace you shall be brought home; Mountains and hills shall break out in song before you, all trees of the field shall clap their hands.

In place of the thornbush, the cypress shall grow, instead of nettles, the myrtle. This shall be to the LORD's renown, as an everlasting sign that shall not fail.

Romans 14:14-23

I know and am persuaded in the Lord Jesus that nothing is unclean in itself; but it is unclean for

anyone who thinks it unclean. If your brother or sister is being injured by what you eat, you are no longer walking in love. Do not let what you eat cause the ruin of one for whom Christ died. So do not let your good be spoken of as evil. For the kingdom of God is not food and drink but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit. The one who thus serves Christ is acceptable to God and has human approval. Let us then pursue what makes for peace and for mutual edification. Do not, for the sake of food, destroy the work of God. Everything is indeed clean, but it is wrong for you to make others fall by what you eat; it is good not to eat meat or drink wine or do anything that makes your brother or sister stumble. The faith that you have, have as your own conviction before God. Blessed are those who have no reason to condemn themselves because of what they approve. But those who have doubts are condemned if they eat, because they do not act from faith; for whatever does not proceed from faith is sin.

John 2:1-11 n the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

Reflection

The holy Church, the Crowned Bride of Christ, is about to enter the Season of the Great Lent - the Passion, death, and Resurrection of Christ our Lord. She is about to enter into the full passion of Christ so that she may live by the life of his resurrection. From this very beginning of the spiritual and mystical journey she looks on forward with hope to the end-goal of her salvation: the victory of the Luminous Cross of Christ her Lord. Her eyes of faith are fixed on this end-goal reflected in the Wedding Feast of the *Kingdom* – with Christ – *her Beloved* – at the center. Today, through the lens of the gospel of Cana, the Bride Church remembers how it all began – when she was first betrothed to her Lord at Cana – at the *mysteries-filled* ceremony of the water and the wine!

We are likewise reminded – at the beginning of this our Lenten journey – of our immigrant church communities who have journeyed out (from Lebanon) in times of hardship and struggle, and yet, continue onward-looking with faith and hope. The symbolic power and the spiritual meanings of this gospel-mosaic of the Wedding Feast at Cana has not escaped many of our Eastern Christian saints as well as seers from early times to the recent. In our modern times, Gibran, has visualized this wedding scene at Cana as if it was being held in a village in Lebanon. In his book Jesus Son of Man - Cana Wedding, Gibran speaks for the bride as she looks forward, with longing, to Jesus' coming to her wedding celebration that evening. He intuitively draws near to that ancient Christian understanding of Christian Matrimony as a union – not the two spouses only – but of three: the bride, the bridegroom, and Christ!

Moreover, our *Hoosoyo* prayers today, reveal the intentions of the Bride-Church as she re-embarks on this spiritual journey of Lent: the Passion, and Resurrection of Jesus, her beloved. She calls on Christ, her heavenly bridegroom, who poured out for her at Cana the wealth of his graces, and appeals to him:

... in your grace shine upon us.

Open the treasure of your abundant compassion to us.

Enrich us with your good gifts..

Seat us at the table of your kingdom and let us drink from your new wine.

Give us the joy of your eternal feast and let us rejoice in the splendor of your face.

Likewise her children call upon him saying:

O Christ, the true wine ..

quench our hearts with the wine of your love!

The intimacy expressed in these prayers has its roots in the faith of the holy fathers and saints of our Maronite-Syriac Church – who always felt Christ being very close with them, as they called out in songs and prayer: *Amono Moryo* – the Lord is with us! Christ Jesus is forever intimately present with his Church especially through the hidden *Mysteries* of the our sacraments. Saint Ephrem spell it out:

In a new way his body
has been fused with our bodies,
and his pure blood
has been poured in our veins.
His voice too is in our ears
and his splendor in our eyes.
The whole of him with the whole of us
is fused by his mercy.
And because he loved his Church greatly,
he did not give her the manna of her rival;
He became the Bread of Life
for her to eat him.

And now, again, at the beginning of this Lenten Journey, we too ask that Christ's Love, Peace, and Joy may remain with his beloved Church – that his grace-filled *Mysteries* may be a renewed source of strength and reassurance for us, her children.



Lenten Regulations

Fast & Abstinence: Ash Monday and Great Friday of the Crucifixion are days of total abstinence from meat and all meat products. In addition to being days of abstinence from meat and meat by products, they are days of mandatory fast, i.e., NOTHING but water is consumed from midnight until noon. One main meal may be consumed after noon. Water and medicine do not break the fast. The law of abstinence binds all Maronite Catholics over fourteen (14) years of age. The law of fasting binds all Maronite Catholics between the age of eighteen (18) and sixty (60). Diabetics and those with health issues are excused from extreme fasting. You are encouraged to fast on all Wednesdays and Fridays of Great Lent; and as many additional days as you find appropriate.

Services for Great Lent: The Services for Great Lent will take place each weekday Tuesday thru Friday. On Tuesdays thru Fridays, the Di vine Liturgy will be celebrated. On Friday evening at 7:00 PM., Stations of the Cross will be celebrated.
