MASS INTENTIONS

Mass intentions are a good way to remember and pray for your loved ones, alive or deceased. If you would like to request an intention please remember to submit your intentions for Liturgy ASAP by calling the parish office at 864.469.9119 or by email at secretary@saintrafka.org. Please remember that it is rare to be able to have your intention the following Sunday! Masses are now generally booked up about three months in advance.

BAPTISM & CHRISMATION

Baptism in the Maronite Rite is always accompanied by Chrismation (Confirmation). Both Sacraments are given by a priest, and always in the same ceremony. Preparation to receive the Sacraments of Baptism and Chrismation is required. We encourage this to happen before the birth of your child. Please contact the Church Office for more details.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Anointing of the Sick is routinely offered during the Divine Liturgy on Wednesday evening and during pastoral visits by the priest to homebound and ill parishioners. Let me know if you will be in the hospital or have other special needs. Contact the Church Office.

THE MYSTERY OF CROWNING (MARRIAGE)

Couples must contact the pastor **at least** six months prior to the desired date of the wedding. To initiate the marriage preparation process or if you have questions for weddings taking place at Saint Rafka. Contact the <u>Church Office</u>.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Registration forms and welcome packets are available in the church office and the vestibule. Membership is a condition for the reception of the sacraments of baptism/confirmation, first reconciliation, first Eucharist, and Crowning (marriage). Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be sacramental sponsors. You must be a registered, contributing member for at least three months before a certificate is provided.

"Could we find another like him," Pharaoh asked his servants, "a man so endowed with the spirit of God?" So Pharaoh said to Joseph: "Since God has made all this known to you, there is no one as discerning and wise as you are. You shall be in charge of my household, and all my people will obey your command. Only in respect to the throne will I outrank you." Then Pharaoh said to Joseph, "Look, I put you in charge of the whole land of Egypt." With that, Pharaoh took off his signet ring and put it on Joseph's finger. He dressed him in robes of fine linen and put a gold chain around his neck. He then had him ride in his second chariot, and they shouted "Abrek!" before him.

Thus was Joseph installed over the whole land of Egypt. "I am Pharaoh," he told Joseph, "but without your approval no one shall lift hand or foot in all the land of Egypt."

1 Thes. 5:1-11


Concerning times and seasons, brothers, you have no need for anything to be written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief at night. When people are saying, "Peace and security," then sudden disaster comes upon them, like labor pains upon a pregnant woman, and they will not escape. But you, brothers, are not in darkness, for that day to overtake you like a thief.-For all of you are children of the light and children of the day. We are not of the night or of darkness. Therefore, let us not sleep as the rest do, but let us stay alert and sober. Those who sleep go to sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night. But since we are of the day, let us be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love and the helmet that is hope for salvation. For God did not destine us for wrath, but to gain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live together with him. Therefore, encourage one

another and build one another up, as indeed you do.

ho, then, is the faithful and prudent servant, whom the master has put in charge of his household to distribute to them their food at the proper time? Blessed is that servant whom his master on his arrival finds doing so. Amen, I say to you, he will put him in charge of all his property. But if that wicked servant says to himself, 'My master is long delayed,' and begins to beat his fellow servants, and eat and drink with

drunkards, the servant's master will come on an unexpected day and at an unknown hour and will punish him severely and assign him a place with the hypocrites, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.



Reflection

"You know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night" (1 Thess. 5:2) St. Paul wrote in today's epistle. The Last Day is an unavoidable reality, but we do not know when it will come. Today's Gospel presents two types of responses servants of the Lord can give to this inevitable day – one servant does as he is instructed, while the other parties and squanders what he has been entrusted because he assumes his Master will be away for a long time. Unfortunately for the second servant, his Master returns when he did not expect Him and he is punished.

But to those who love Christ, to the servant who he has been instructed by the Gospel, His return is a frightening event to dread, but an event we await with great eagerness. The servant who does not do as he has been instructed rightly fears the day his Master returns because he knows he will get in trouble for his purposeful disobedience. But the servants who try their best to follow their Master's commands simply wish to see their Master again for their love of the Master is the same reason they follow His commands. And Christ, our Master, has not left us with commands to simply busy us, but because He knows best, as our omnipotent God and Creator, what should bring fulfillment and holiness.

Christ never said the instructions He has left would be always simple or easy, but He invites us to imitate Him, saying "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23). Knowing we would face great challenges in the world at times to complete His commands, Christ left us with every divine tool needed to overcome them. As St. Paul wrote, "Let us be sober, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet. For God did not appoint us to suffer wrath but to receive salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Thess. 5:8-9). Faith and hope

is our armor in the world, and our greatest weapon is the cross of Christ that protects us from harm and evil for God does not wish us to suffer, but to rejoice with Him forever in His love.

Equipped with faith, hope and love, and armed with the cross, we are prepared to face any challenge, whether our Lord will return tomorrow or in a thousand years. God is timeless, as is His love. If we truly wish to emulate Him, we must imitate His timeless love, not only in reciprocity to Him but to one another. Perhaps one of the greatest apparent crosses to carry and challenges we face in opposition to our faith and hope is Christ's command to love our enemies and pray for them (Matt. 5:44). But that is, in fact, not in opposition but essential to how Christ has equipped us. We will only defeat our enemies in an ultimate sense by loving them – not in a naïve way thinking that everyone shall become our friends, but with the same love that God loves even those who offend Him. If God in His love wishes that we should be saved, then we must also love our enemies with the hope that we can all enter heaven. We can begin today to prepare concretely for the last day with things as simple as praying for those who wish us ill, and being the one to reach out and make peace when possible.

The day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night, sneaking up on us. It is left to us whether we shall receive it in great joy because we will see the Master we love so dearly, or be horrified when we realize we have neglected His commands.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

I have offered many prayers and Masses of thanksgiving that we were spared of life and limb during and after Hurricane Helene. What made it harder for me was to not be there. I was seeing the local news reports via the internet while in Alaska. It was a helpless feeing, but talking to people via text, I was able to learn of damage, power outages, repairs, etc.

Pope Francis has called for a global day of prayer and fasting on Oct. 7 to mark the one-year anniversary of the Hamas attack on Israel amid escalating violence in the region. "I ask everyone to take part in a day of fasting and prayer for peace in the world." Pope Francis said on Oct. 2 that the Church is always at the service of humanity, "especially in this dramatic hour of our history, as the winds of war and the fires of violence continue to ravage entire peoples and nations." Pope Francis also revealed that he will personally go to Rome's Basilica of St. Mary Major on Sunday to pray the rosary on the eve of the anniversary "to invoke the gift of peace through the intercession of Most Holy Mary." The Pope and our American Bishops have asked that we all pray the rosary this month for world peace and the upcoming presidential election.

On Tuesday, October 8, there will be a special screening of *Heart of a Servant*, the Father Flanagan Story. **Father Edward Flanagan** was a legend in the United States and beyond for his great love for homeless children. He started with nothing and built up Boys Town into a city unto itself. Join us at Regal Theaters on Woodruff Road on October 8 at 7:05 PM. Details <u>here</u>.

The Fifteenth Annual Benefit Dinner for the Eparchy of Saint Maron will take place on Thursday, October 24, 2024 at The Union League Club in Manhattan (www.unionleagueclub.org) when we will celebrate "Our Spirituality Gives Us Hope". This year our worthy honorees will be Bassam and Mirna Ayoub, members of Our Lady of Lebanon Cathedral, Brooklyn, NY, and Doctor Charbel Ishak and Doctor Maria Ajaimy members of St. John Paul II Maronite Parish, Sleepy Hollow, NY. The Annual Benefit Dinner is very important for the Eparchy, as it provides needed support for seminarians, missions, retired priests, ministries and the vulnerable in Lebanon.

The American Bishops have also called on all Catholics to observe a Day of Fasting and Prayer on Friday, November 1, 2024, the Friday before the Presidential election. This is a highly unusual request as normally Solemnities and Feasts of the Church cannot be days of fasting, but the bishops felt that because this election has the population so divided and the ramifications are so important, it was best to pray in a special way just before the election. Just as the Ninevites fasted and prayed and God heard them, may we be like the Ninevites, and pray with all our heart. May God hear our humble prayers and spare our nation from harm from enemies within.




